Proposed Teacher Staffing and classes for 2021

Over the previous two weeks the leadership team in consultation with teachers have begun to structure our classes for 2022. We have anticipated a reduction in our total enrolments and are looking at a majority of straight year levels next year. A number of factors are taken into consideration when we are looking at classroom makeup and this is subject to change depending on our enrolments next year.

We are starting the new year with 11 classes. Education QLD provides staffing based on the number of students who are enrolled and present at school on the 8th day of the school year. If we have more students than anticipated we gain an additional teacher and if we have less we lose a teacher. If this occurs, changes are made to class groupings.

Curriculum Corner

Getting children involved in cooking from a young age is an important life skill and helps to cultivate healthy eating habits. Healthy eating benefits children's growth and holistic development. It also boosts children's immunity and prevents them from falling sick easily.

Currently the Prep/1 students are looking at procedures and writing clear and detailed instructions.

You might wish to start involving your child in the daily sandwich making process with a view to learning how to independently make their own. As well as teaching life skills, it is a great bonding activity that you can do together.

Ingredients: Bread, wraps, flat bread, pita-pocket, lettuce leaf etc. Spreads – butter, avocado, nut butter, cream cheese or mayonnaise Filling – Fruit (banana, sultanas), vegetables, cheese slices, cold meats – Anything nutritious and colourful

Steps/Method:

- 1. Allow children to choose their own vessel, spreads and fillings.
- 2. Apply a spread This can be a difficult task for children to master. Encourage them to keep the knife blade horizontal to the bread rather than pointing/digging it in to prevent mangled sandwiches.

- 3. Decorate with fillings You and your child can come up with special designs to make it fun.
- 4. Cut into triangles, rectangles, squares or other shapes.
- 5. Be creative

Although it can take some time and patience initially to teach children to make their own sandwiches, it can be a greatly underestimated life skill achievement and can give them a sense of pride and independence. Enjoy the process of making healthy sandwiches or any much-loved recipe with your child.

A huge thank you to our wonderful community, staff and students who supported our final Book Fair for 2021. With your support, we were able to get all of these books for FREE!!


