# **The Honour of Old Torquay**

History of Torquay Stare School

Torquay State School was first opened in 21 January 1901 as Torquay Provisional School. It became Torquay State School on 1 June 1909. It was originally located on the corner of Barnstaple and Honiton Street. (There was no railway line as yet).

Miss Margaret Moreland was appointed as the first Head Teacher and Annie Rickenberg was the first pupil to enrol. She was 6 years old.

The school began with less than 30 students. Some of the old names of the students have now become popular again. Names like Eva, Isobel, Thomas, Ivy, Herbert, Annie and Arthur. Most of the children had to walk through the bush to get to their new school.

The school was built in six months at the cost of 97pounds, that's \$171 Aust dollar!!!

The school was set up on blocks, just like a Queenslander, with no concrete underneath and bushland all around.

The Department gave the school the number 945, which is still used to this current day and the school was then relocated to its current position in 1937.

Our school is now located in a great position as it is one of the oldest beachside suburbs. Researched by Year 6 boys.
