From the Principal

Creating global citizens

As technology continues to shrink our world and increase global connections, it is important for our students to become global citizens. This means learning history, geography, civics and citizenship. It also encompasses the values of caring, kindness, thinking of others and contributing without expecting personal gain. Being involved in events such as ANZAC day, Remembrance Day, Clean Up Australia Day, The Urangan Pier Centenary, etc are all ways that our school assists students to develop these skills and values. It is exciting that our student leaders' team has suggested a fundraiser where the funds go back into the community via Barnados.

The National Curriculum also supports the development of global citizenship and I have included an extract from Humanities and Social Sciences.

In the Australian Curriculum, the Humanities and Social Sciences learning area includes a study of history, geography, civics and citizenship and economics and business. The humanities and social sciences are the study of human behaviour and interaction in social, cultural, environmental, economic and political contexts. The humanities and social sciences have a historical and contemporary focus, from personal to global contexts, and consider challenges for the future. Through studying Humanities and Social Sciences, students will develop the ability to question, think critically, solve problems, communicate effectively, make decisions and adapt to change. Thinking about and responding to issues requires an understanding of the key historical, geographical, political, economic and societal factors involved, and how these different factors interrelate. The Humanities and Social Science subjects in the Australian Curriculum provide a broad understanding of the world in which we live, and how people can participate as active and informed citizens with high-level skills needed for the 21st century.

ANZAC Day at Torquay State School

As part of developing global citizens, each year the staff and students of Torquay State School acknowledge the service and sacrifice of our veterans in a formal service for all year levels, led by our student leaders. This year we propose to hold the service at 2:00pm on 24 April in the school hall. This will be confirmed closer to the date. Our student leaders follow a service process suggested and approved by the RSL. As part of this service, one of the student leaders recites the Prayer of Remembrance:

"Today we remember with thanksgiving those who made the supreme sacrifice for us in time of war. We pray that the offering of their lives may not have been in vain. Today we dedicate ourselves to the cause of justice, freedom and peace; and for the wisdom and strength to build a better world."

If you do not wish for your child to be part of this prayer, please notify the office in writing by 21 April. Students would exit the Hall for the prayer and return after the prayer has been recited.



The school has also been invited by the RSL to participate in the Hervey Bay commemoration service for ANZAC Day on 25 April. Staff and students who wish to march with the school are asked to be at the Hunter St side of Bay Plaza (Pialba Woolworths) by 8:30 am, with the march to begin at 9:15am. The RSL have also advised us that as per Workplace Health and Safety guidelines parents are asked not to join the students during the march.

Parents who do not wish to stay for the service at Freedom Park will need to notify staff in attendance at the march and arrange to meet their student at the end of the march before the group enters Freedom Park. We will also have ANZAC Day memorabilia for sale at the school on Friday 21 April and Monday 24 April from the Science Lab. Items include: Horse Badge \$2.50, Australia Remembers Badges \$2.00

Roadworks Notification

QParents is Coming !!!

Torquay State School is proud to be one the first schools in Queensland to offer QParents.

The QParents web and mobile application provides a more convenient, easier way for parents and legal guardians of Queensland state school students to interact with their child's school. Parents will have secure, online access to their child's student information, anytime, anywhere, through a smartphone, tablet or computer. QParents allows parents to connect instantly with their child's school to access and manage their child's student information, including:

- Attendance and absence details, as well as the ability to notify the school of an absence
- Positive Behaviour information
- Academic report cards
- Viewing unpaid invoice details, payment history, and making payments online
- Viewing and updating student details, including medical conditions and address
- Upcoming Events

Please note at this stage we will not be activating the Assessment Planner or Negative Behaviour data set but you will still see the heading for this in your QParents page. QParents will assist both staff and parents in sharing and responding to information in an efficient and effective way. It won't replace the traditional ways you communicate with our school, but it will provide another way to communicate with us!

The benefits of QParents

Convenience and time savings for parents

- Parents can view or update their child's details without having to contact the school
- Secure 24/7 online access.
- Available anytime, anywhere — access QParents on your smart phone, tablet or computer.

Greater transparency of information

- Improves accountability between parents and schools by providing parents with timely access to their child's information online.
- Allows parents to engage more deeply in their child's schooling

Improved administration efficiencies for schools

- Allows schools to streamline their administrative processes and cut down on printing

What is a QParents Account Owner (QPAO)?

The school will nominate one parent or legal guardian for each student to be the QParents Account Owner (QPAO). The QPAO will be able to register for QParents to access and manage the student's information online. A student's QPAO will be able to view the student's information and submit requests to update some of the student's details. The QPAO will also be able to invite other people (such as another parent or family member), to view the student's information. Once invited, these people can register for QParents as "delegated viewers". A delegated viewer can see the student's details, but cannot make updates.

Registering for QParents

You will receive an invitation email or letter from us containing your unique invitation code during term 2. Simply follow the instructions in that email or letter to complete the QParents account registration process. If you do not want to register, you can just ignore the invitation and your child's student information will not be available to anyone through QParents. Or, if you want another parent to be the QPAO, you can advise us and we will send them an invitation email or letter with their own unique invitation code.

Identity verification

When registering as a QPAO, you will need to verify 100 points of identity documents online. The 100 points can be made up of documents in the following list:

Australian Passport	50 pts	Australian Marriage Certificate	40 pts
Australian Driver Licence	50 pts	Australian Citizenship Certificate	40 pts
Australian Birth Certificate	50 pts	Change of Name Certificate	40 pts
Medicare Card	20 pts	Australian Visa (foreign passports)	20 pts

If you only have 60-90 points of the above ID documents you can still register for QParents, but you will need to attend the school for an additional check after you have registered online.

If you don't have sufficient documents, you might like to nominate another parent as the QPAO.

Where does the information about my child come from?

All of the information that is presented in QParents comes from the IT system that is used by all Queensland state schools. Schools will continue to manage student information in this system, and the information will be extracted and presented in QParents.

Will my child's information be secure?

Yes. QParents is a secure portal that meets strict industry standards. Only people with the right to access information about their child will be given an account; no one else. If you don't want to register for QParents, your account will not be created and your child's information will not be made available through QParents.

Health News

Hand Foot and Mouth Disease Notification

Please be advised we have received notification of one confirmed case of hand, foot & mouth disease of one Prep student in our school. The student has no other siblings in other year levels. Queensland Health provides the following information:

Hand, foot and mouth disease (HFMD) is usually a mild illness that occurs mainly in young children, but can also affect older children and adults. It is caused by a number of different enteroviruses, particularly coxsackie viruses. It is not related to the foot- and-mouth disease that affects cattle, sheep and pigs. The virus is spread from an infectious person by contact with fluid from the blisters, their nose and throat secretions (such as saliva, sputum, or nasal mucus) and faeces. A person with hand, foot and mouth disease is most infectious in the first week of the illness. Skin blisters are no longer infectious when they have crusted over, but the virus can be spread in faeces for several weeks after the person has recovered. Children and staff with hand, foot and mouth disease are excluded from school and childcare facilities until all blisters have dried.

Signs and Symptoms:

Hand, foot and mouth disease usually begins with a mild fever and a runny nose. This is followed by a sore throat and mouth, with the appearance of blisters in the mouth, and on hands and feet. Sometimes blisters may also be seen on knees, elbows or in the nappy area. The blisters usually last for 3–5 days. Dehydration can sometimes occur as the pain from the blisters may stop the person from eating and drinking.

Prevention:

Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and dry thoroughly before handling food; and after going to the toilet, touching soiled linen and articles and changing nappies. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces and soiled items, including toys. Avoid sharing cups, eating utensils, items of personal hygiene (eg towels, washers and toothbrushes), and clothing (especially shoes and socks). Teach children about cough and sneeze etiquette.

Health outcome:

Hand, foot and mouth disease is a viral illness common in children. Symptoms are usually mild, and include high temperature and small blister-like lesions on the inside of the mouth, palms of hands, soles of feet, and the nappy area. There is no clear evidence that HFMD causes any problems with pregnancy or the unborn baby. However, pregnant women may pass the virus to the baby if they are infected shortly before delivery or have symptoms at the time of delivery. Newborns infected with the virus can, very rarely, develop serious and sometimes fatal illness. LEMphonics News

What do I Hear?

This is the first question we should always ask when we are attempting to spell a word...**What do I hear????** This is a skill which needs to be taught! We can't presume the students already have this skill. As parents and caregivers, you may have been taught to memorise the letters in a word rather than recognise the sounds that you hear. When attempting to spell a word, the first step is to find how many sounds we can hear in the word. E.g, the word **cat** is made up of 3 sounds – c a t. The following words are also made up of 3 sounds – b a th, h ear d, s i ng. Here are some words with 4 sounds – l u n ch, a f t er, f ou n d, a l th ough. The underlined letters in the words above, indicate that these are multiple phonograms and they are making just one sound. Here are some words for you to try. How many sounds are in the following words? Remember 'What do I hear?' They, pork, reach, lunch, paper, circus, thought, watch, health, daughter. The next step when spelling is to decide which phonogram to use for that sound. For example, the sound 'ay' may be represented by seven different phonograms – a(2nd sound), ay, ai, eigh, ei(2), ey(2), ea(3). We call these groups **Sound Families**. The sounds 'or' and 'oo' also have seven sounds in their families.

or – a(4), or, aw, au, augh, ar(2).

o(3)- u(2,1), ui, ew, oo, ou(3), ough(2).

ee – e(2), ea, ei, ie

o(2) – oa, oe, ough, ow(2), ou(2).

We introduce rules then to explain which phonogram we use to make that sound in a word. I will introduce these rules after the holidays. Happy holidays, Miss Miller.
